Other happy news is that there have been five people at Monduli Juu (upper Monduli) recently who have given their lives to Jesus and been baptized into Him. Now the young Monduli Juu congregation is planning a February Outreach Day for women and girls 12 years old and up, to especially share Jesus with our non-Christian friends. 
